Time to Program Completion

Our doctoral students must complete all program requirements for the doctorate within 7 years from matriculation. Extensions may be granted to students who have extenuating circumstance and can document consistency in their efforts to complete their dissertations.

Please note that over the past decade we have enacted more stringent criteria for extensions beyond our program's 7-year statute of limitations, and greater support for students to complete dissertations earlier. The numbers below include graduates studying prior to the introduction of these measures.

Financial Aid

Financial aid is awarded on the basis of need and is offered primarily in the form of student loans. AUNE-based grants and scholarships are limited, with the majority coming from the very competitive Jonathan Daniels Scholarship Fund, which awards from \$500 to 50% of tuition.

Students are awarded federal work-study based on financial need, and the Office of Financial Aid maintains a list where students have successfully applied for and been granted aid from private or outside sources.

Internships

The completion of an internship is a requirement for the doctorate. We have an excellent history of internship placements. Our average annual percentage is 90%
