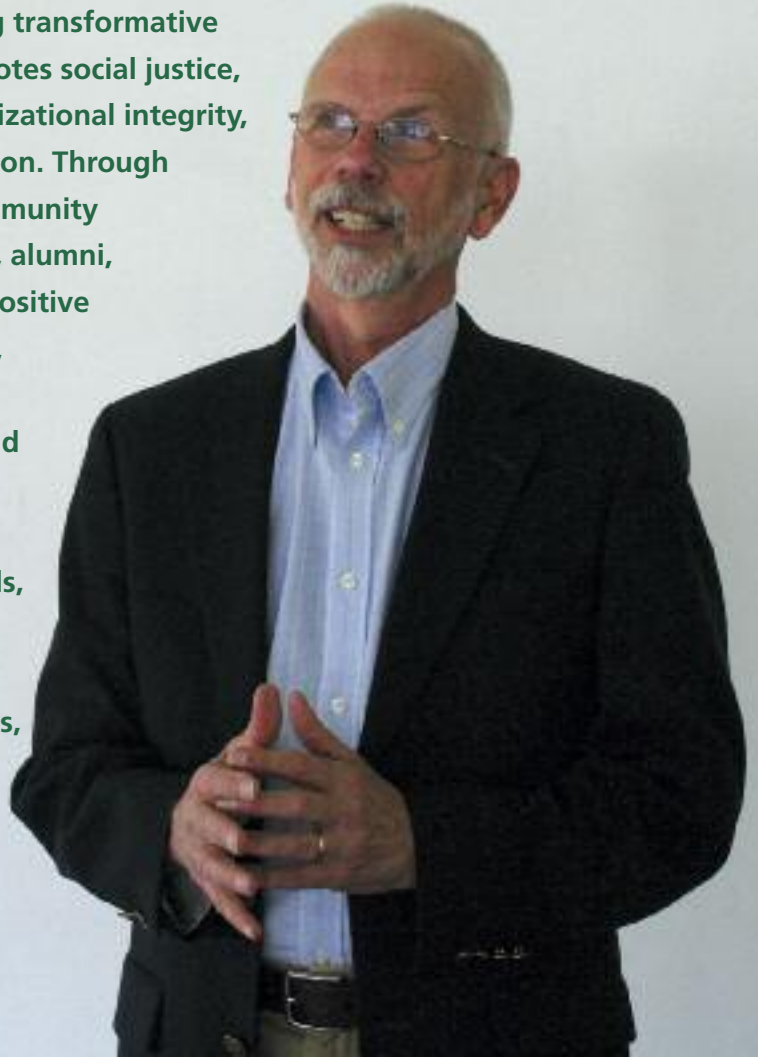

# Putting Knowledge into Action

Through our practice-centered master's, doctoral, and certificate programs, Antioch University New England looks beyond our own immediate boundaries. We reach deeply into the world around us to forge meaningful connections. Social justice and sustainability are local, domestic, and global issues, and are directly addressed by our students, faculty, staff, and alumni. Practicum, internship, or capstone projects are part of every curriculum at AUNE.

Sue Patrolia was in the first Green MBA cohort. "This program laid out all the problems, possibilities, options, and opportunities for me." Her practicum project was to help small businesses operate in more sustainable ways. "Many business owners don't have time to focus on anything but keeping the doors open, so I want to give them the inspiration and tools they need."

Sue combined the ideas and skills embodied in the Green MBA into her work as a product manager for a firm that imports woven upholstery fabrics, handling design, marketing, and product development. She founded Sample Waste Initiative for Furniture and Textiles (SWIFT); one of its projects was Green Initiatives for Furniture and Textiles, finding ways to reuse leftover fabric to help children in need. The program was awarded first place in Net Impact's 2008 Green Challenge.

In 2009, David Wiley received the U.S. Commerce Department's Gold Medal—its highest award for distinguished service. The research for which he won the award examined whale behavior and the traffic patterns of ships going into and out of Boston Harbor. During his study he identified a smaller shipping lane, safer for whales, and brought about agreement from shippers to use the new lane. "I knew that behavioral change involved social conflict. AUNE's PhD program allowed me to fuse biology and sociology, the interdisciplinary approach I was looking for. At the same time, the program changed how I was seeing things."

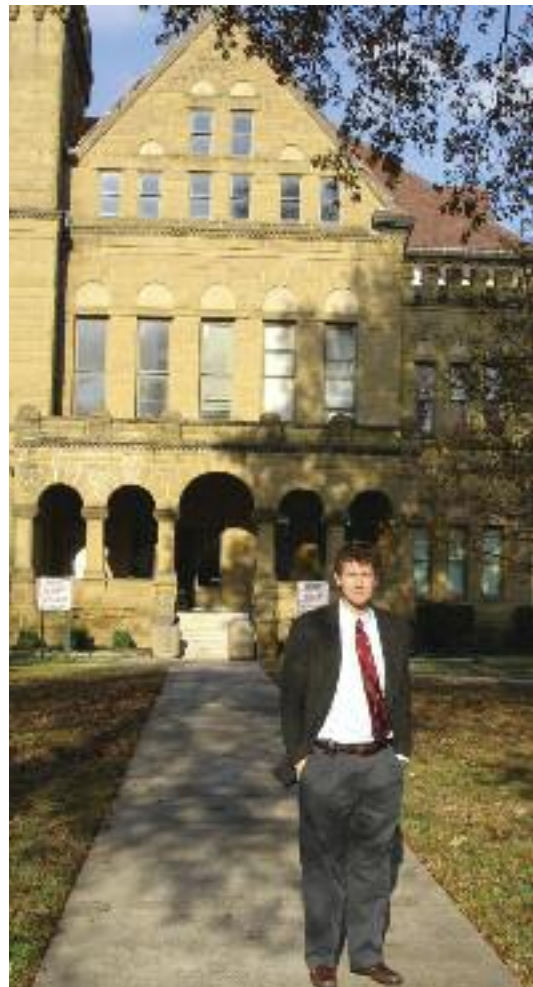

# Learning and Serving

**AUNE students, faculty and staff learn and serve through their work on projects, grants, and services delivered by our centers and institutes.**

The **Antioch Center for School Renewal (ACSR)** provides a broad range of services for schools and educators through its workshops and outreach programs.

The **Antioch New England Institute (ANEI)** is our nonprofit community outreach organization, providing training and resources to domestic and international partners in leadership development, place-based education, nonprofit management, environmental education and policy, smart growth, public administration, project evaluation, and program assessment. ANEI is also the home of the New Hampshire Selectperson Institute.



The **Antioch Couple and Family Therapy Institute** offers affordable support and therapy to individuals, couples, and families working through a variety of life issues. The Institute doubles as a state-of-the-art clinical training facility for master's and doctoral students in our Marriage and Family Therapy programs.

The **Antioch Psychological Services Center (PSC)** is a community psychological clinic offering individual, couple, family, and group counseling, testing and assessment, and other services. With excellent faculty supervision, Clinical Psychology doctoral students use the PSC for training and research.

The **Center for Autism Spectrum Disorders Training** delivers in-depth knowledge and essential training through continuing education workshops and courses for people working with individuals on the autism spectrum. The Center also hosts an annual exposition and conference for the public.





The **Center for Place-Based Education** promotes community-based education programs that encourage partnerships between students, teachers, and community members that strengthen and support student achievement, community vitality, and a healthy environment.

The **Center for Research on Psychological Practice** (CROPP) serves as a consultation center for mental health professionals and agencies seeking help with effectiveness, intervention, and program evaluation.

The **Center for Tropical Ecology and Conservation** (CTEC), reflects AUNE's commitment to the environment. CTEC promotes education and research to find creative, long-term solutions to the challenges facing tropical ecosystems. The Center trains future scientists, educators, managers, and policy makers to become environmental leaders.



The **Antioch University New England Multicultural Center for Research and Practice** promotes multiculturalism within a social justice orientation, with a focus on culturally diverse and immigrant youth, adults, and families in the New England area. Housed in the Center is **Disaster Shakti**, a volunteer team of doctoral clinical psychology students who reach out to disaster survivors. While participating in the resilience promotion of survivors, clinical students gain experience in social justice outreach.

In his final report to the foundation that sponsored his work, Kenold noted that the major environmental problems facing the region—forest depletion, soil erosion, degradation in water quality—were the direct consequences of local people's activities. Though sobering, his work provided the basis for a community development plan to reverse more than half a century of environmental decline.

# The Admissions Process

## WHAT MAKES AN ANTIOCH UNIVERSITY NEW ENGLAND STUDENT?

The quality of the experience is only as good as the match of the student to the school. Here are the questions we ask of our applicants:

- Do you have the academic background and experience to be prepared for graduate study?
- Does the program to which you are applying meet your educational or professional goals?
- Do you have the interpersonal skills to be successful in both Antioch University New England's community and the field you have chosen?

## HOW TO APPLY

When you're ready to be considered for admission to Antioch University New England, you'll need to provide us with the following information:\*

- A completed and signed application form (online at [antiochne.edu](http://antiochne.edu)), a personal statement, and your résumé or CV;
- A non-refundable application fee of \$50 (doctoral \$75);
- An official transcript from each accredited college or university you attended, indicating courses taken and degree(s) earned;
- Three letters of recommendation, preferably from individuals who have been able to personally evaluate your work; and
- A personal interview will be scheduled with a faculty member from the department to which you are applying.
- Certain programs also require a supplementary application. These include: Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Dance/Movement Therapy and Counseling, Marriage and Family Therapy, Organizational and Environmental Sustainability, Waldorf Teacher Education, and programs in Environmental Studies.

## Tuition and Financial Aid

### TUITION

Every aspect of an Antioch University New England education is geared toward the needs of the student. Many of our students are working professionals, often with families to support. Master's program tuition is assessed per credit and fees are assessed by semester for each degree and certificate program, each of which has a minimum number of required semesters. # Keene and the Monadnock Region

With a population of 23,000, Keene is a small city gifted with well-developed social and educational resources. The hub of town is its historic Central Square, downtown's community gathering place and the gateway to Keene's wide array of dining, shopping, and entertainment offerings.

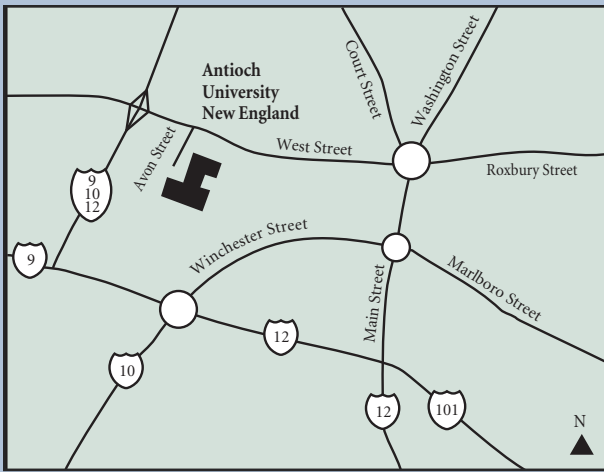
Nestled in the Ashuelot River Valley, Keene is surrounded by rolling wooded hills, streams, and ponds that beckon outdoor enthusiasts, naturalists, and backwoods adventurers. At 3,165 feet, nearby Mount Monadnock is said to be the most frequently climbed mountain in North America.

Entertainment is close at hand at Main Street's Colonial Theatre, which schedules a varied lineup of independent films, plays, ballets, and live musical events ranging from classical orchestra to acoustic rock. Boston and its abundance of cultural attractions and diversions is just over two hours away.

In the fall, the Monadnock Region comes alive with the color of turning leaves. Keene has become somewhat synonymous with autumn as the home of the annual Pumpkin Festival, during which the town regularly breaks its world record for the number of carved, lit jack-o'-lanterns.

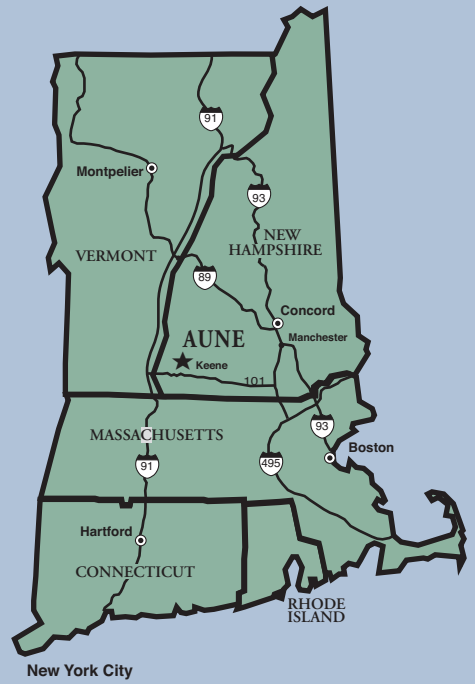
